

Lesson Observation DVD resources

The primary pack contains five units, the secondary six units and the special school four units.

Each one includes video clips from a lesson which are identified in the main menu and include a 'play all' facility and individual chapters. Some units in the primary and secondary packs have additional supporting materials.

Where possible each unit includes:

- a discussion with the teacher(s) concerned to give a context and brief background to the lesson
- sections of the lesson
- a discussion with pupils after the lesson
- examples of pupils' work undertaken in the lesson
- plans for the lesson
- examples of resources used to support learning.

The special school pack has examples of teaching resources, lesson plans and a completed evaluation form to support staff discussions.

Some units have an additional discussion with the teacher about assessment arrangements, an overview of the curriculum and home learning. It is important to note that the lesson clips are edited to provide only a snapshot of teaching and learning.

At the time of filming each of the schools was judged as outstanding by Ofsted. Information about the context of each school and those staff involved is given in the resource.

The lesson clips and discussions with staff and pupils are not necessarily designed to be viewed in their entirety in one sitting. It is useful to dip into the various chapters for different aspects of triangulation when evaluating teaching, learning and assessment. This is particularly the case as a prelude to staff discussions.

The pack aims to provide opportunities for staff to consider the use of 'triangulation' through a small analysis of pupils' work and consideration of pupils' thoughts about their learning and how learning is supported. To assist staff in capturing their thoughts when observing lesson clips and in discussions, a blank evidence form is included.
